## TSSD's Metal Detecting Outing

The Treasure Seekers of San Diego had its first ever organized competition hunt on Sunday, August 17th. Despite the fact that parking was a bit tight, a total of 19 hunters participated. Maybe "competition" isn't the correct term as there weren't prizes awarded to whoever found the most coins or highest cash total. The only thing participants had to do was go fast and collect all the targets they could and find as many tokens as they could. The tokens were redeemable for silver quarters, halves, buffalo nickels, large cents, shield nickels and maybe some others. All other coins they found they got to keep.

The hunt lasted about an hour which might have been longer than necessary since it got awfully quiet in the field after about 45 minutes. It seems like the field had been hunted out! This is remarkable since we buried in excess of 1700 coins. I didn't keep a tally of finds, but everybody found coins and some made their entrance fee back (\$5). If anybody is looking for a standard to try for, I think Brian Winter found over 200 coins and made about \$20! But he was REALLY moving his machine!

Everyone I talked with commented on how much fun they had. And I'll add what a good job they did finding targets. I went back to the field on the day after to check what was missed. I gridded the entire field and found a total of 3 dimes and a rusty paper clip! This equates to a target recovery of at least 99.8%! This is outstanding since in many other hunts I've entered; there have been LOTS of targets left on the field. I know because I usually do an "after-hunt". Good work folks!

A thank you to Rich Hegyi for getting there and securing a table for us as well as contributing 3 tokens for bottles of wine.

So I suppose the next question is, "When's the next hunt?"

We'll see what we can do.

**Miner's Cookbook Corner:**

**Individual Pear/Apple Cheddar Crisp****Filling:**

- 3 Cups Pears or Apples, cored, peeled and diced
- 2 Cups Cranberries (optional)
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans, almond or walnuts (also optional)
- 3 ounces cheddar cheese, thinly sliced or cubed

**Crumb Topping:**

- 1/2 cup quick-cooking rolled oats
- 1 Tablespoon packed Brown Sugar (can use splenda or sugar twin)
- 1/4- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/8 teaspoon nutmeg (optional)
- 4 teaspoons light butter with canola oil (like land o lake), melted

Preheat oven 400 degrees f. Use 8- 4 oz. size mason jelly jars; this is a single size serving, 1/2 cup.  
Light butter or spray each jar and place on a cookie sheet.

Mix the pears/apples and cranberries in a bowl, toss in the cheese and nuts, then divide into the jars evenly.

In a small bowl mix the rest of the ingredients for the crumb topping, spoon the crumble topping on each of the jars.

Bake about 10 -15 minutes or until cheese is melted and tops are lightly browned.



Bring: Chairs, Your food and drink, a hat and wear comfortable clothing.

**What does TSSD do at these events:**

TSSD sets up a few tables under awnings. On one or two of these tables are panning tubs which allows us to teach the children (and adults) how to pan for gold. When teaching the children we use play ground sand and pyrite, sometimes a few polished gems are included. If the public decides to purchase one of our gold bags, we assist them in learning how to pan for real gold. The other table(s) hold brochure information pertaining to our club and the G.P.A.A.. On occasion we have been known to sell our gold bags, dowsing rods and other merchandise that we are able to obtain. Lately TSSD has been introducing children (and adults) to the world of metal detecting. If the space is available TSSD ‘salts’ an area with coins and invite the children to come detect the field. These metal detecting hunts are offered at specific times of the day.

It is a fun filled day. You get to spend some time with fellow members and meet the public and educate them to the wonders of the outdoors. Try it – you might like it.

**Gems of Pala Highlights:** You will find the Gems of Pala store at one of the most widely recognized tourmaline mines in the world, the Stewart Mine. It is in the San Diego County community of Pala, which provides one of the world's [richest deposits of pink tourmaline](#). Rock hounds and gemstone enthusiasts come from all over the world to find Pala tourmaline.

The Stewart Mine holds the record for being the largest pegmatite mining operation in the history of the U.S. This took place in the late 19th century when the last Chinese Dynasty sought to acquire all of the pink tourmaline in California. The Stewart Mine is also famous for its lepidolite, which comes in lilac, lavender, and pink colors. Plenty of pink tourmaline and green tourmaline, which the Chinese did not desire, can be found.

Although you will not be allowed to enter the Stewart Mine, buckets of mining dirt are brought out to their Gems of Pala store where enthusiasts can sift through the buckets of gem filled dirt. You will be given instructions and given the tools to sift through the dirt. Anything you find is yours to keep.

Dress appropriately since it can get hot in Pala during the summer. Wear something you don't mind getting dusty, a hat, and sunscreen. Bring gloves (the kinds you would use to clean kitchens or bathrooms) if you don't want to sift through wet pilings with your bare hands. Also, bring containers to carry your gems home.

(Note: This is not related to the [Oceanview Mine](#), which is further up Magee Road.)

**Claims Assessment Work Form:**

Each and every time you are at one of TSSD's claims, you should be completing a Claims Assessment Work Form (located in the front of the claims guides, or at the meetings from the Claims Guide Seller). This form needs to be turned into Robert Cook, TSSD Claims Manager, at the meetings or e-mailing it to him at: [rmjcc@cox.net](mailto:rmjcc@cox.net) or surface mail to: 1941 Rockhoff Road, Escondido, CA 92026-1113.

Needed information required: Claim used, Members name, Date used, Total people prospecting and time on the claim, Type of work done (clean up, maintain, filling in holes, etc.), Members signature, Claims access, Vehicle access, Claim Markers, Claims Guide Directions, Type of equipment used, Type of gold found.

It sounds like a lot, but it really is not. This information is needed to prove that our claims are being worked. If BLM questions us as to the use of our claims or wants to close one of our areas to prospecting we want to be able to produce records that show that our claims are being used.

**G.P.A.A.:**

Treasure Seekers of San Diego is a chapter of G.P.A.A.. This does not require you to become a member of G.P.A.A. but if you are, please advise them that you are also a member of TSSD, so that we are eligible for 'points' from your membership. TSSD uses those 'points' to obtain opportunity raffle items.
