Take a simple test after watching a 2 and ½ minute video and you will have your permit. Good for one year. This is needed for BBQ's, propane stoves and camp fires.

Permits can be issued by the US Forest Service (USFS), Bureau of Land Management (BLM), National Park Service (NPS), and the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE) or online at PreventWildfireCA.org/Permits

Miner's Cookbook Corner:

Bacon & Onion Foil Packet Potatoes

2 to 3 sheets of heavy-duty foil
1 packet onion soup powder, (like Lipton)
10-12 baby red potatoes, thinly sliced or cubed
12 slices of cooked and crumbled bacon or used the Oscar Myer already cooked
1 small onion thinly sliced and diced
1 cup sharp cheese (optional)
Salt and pepper to taste
3 tablespoons olive oil or butter
Sour cream for serving (optional)

Spray each sheet of foil with cooking spray.

In a mixing bowl add the onion soup mix, potatoes, olive oil, salt and pepper.

Spoon equal portions of the potatoes on the foil, top with the cheese

Wrap securely.

Grill for 20 to 30 minutes. Or you can bake it in the oven, at 350° for about 35 minutes or till done. Let stand 10 minutes before serving. Serve in foil, topped with sour cream if desired

Warner Springs Gem Claim One Day Outing Saturday, March 21st, 2015 9:00 AM meeting time Indian Flats Campground, Cleveland National Forest

- 1. This claim belongs to SPMA and they are allowing TSSD members a chance to explore it.
- 2. The claim information is located in your TSSD Claims Guide.
- 3. This claim can offer: Garnets, Quartz, Albite, Feldspar, Tourmaline and others.
- 4. Some members will be metal detecting around the campground (which is not part of the claim).
- 5. Bring your own food and water. There is a vault toilet located in the campground.
- 6. You will need a National Forest Service Adventure Pass. (Big 5 Sporting Goods)
- 7. You will need to bring small bills with you, as there is a charge to park at the campground. \$12.00 per day or per night there is no difference between day use and overnight. (per Palomar Ranger District on 02-25-2015, 760.788.0250) \$5.00 per day/night for additional vehicles.
- 8. Only hand tools are permitted to work this claim.
- 9. There is a private claim within this claim called "Cryo-Genie" we do NOT have permission to work that claim and it is very well marked. Stay off this claim.
- 10. You must have your TSSD Membership Card in possession and the TSSD Claims Guide while on this claim.
- 11. Distance from Escondido is approximately 48 miles.
- 12. From the town of Warner Springs:

Go approximately 2 miles NORTH of Warner Springs on Hwy. 79.

But if parts are lost or broken, it is the responsibility of the 'borrower" to repair or replace missing or broken parts. Further details of the equipment check out policy is on the form which you will sign when receiving the item.

Earl Sterrett, 858-922-4547, will be able to assist you with the equipment checkout. He asks that you give him a couple of days' notice when you might need something, and when items are returned that they are CLEAN. All equipment must be returned by the meeting following when it was checked out. Equipment is located at Diablo Mini Storage in Escondido.

G.P.A.A.:

Treasure Seekers of San Diego is a chapter of G.P.A.A.. This does not require you to become a member of G.P.A.A. but if you are, please advise them that you are also a member of TSSD, so that we are eligible for 'points' from your membership. Claims Assessment Work Form:

Each and every time you are at one of TSSD's claims, you should be completing a Claims Assessment Work Form (located in the front of the claims guides, or at the meetings from the Claims Guide Seller). This form needs to be turned into Robert Cook, TSSD Claims Manager, at the meetings or e-mailing it to him at: rmicc@cox.net or surface mail to: 1941 Rockhoff Road, Escondido, CA 92026-1113. Needed information required: Claim used, Members name, Date used, Total people prospecting and time on the claim, Type of work done (clean up, maintain, filling in holes, etc.), Members signature, Claims access, Vehicle access, Claim Markers, Claims Guide Directions, Type of equipment used, Type of gold found.

It sounds like a lot, but it really is not. This information is needed to prove that our claims are being worked. If BLM questions us as to the use of our claims or wants to close one of our areas to prospecting we want to be able to produce records that show that our claims are being used.
