**Miner's Cookbook Corner:**

**Cajun Cabbage Casserole**  
**Spicy One Dish Kick Ass Casserole**

Great for potlucks as well

1 Tablespoon vegetable oil  
1 pound lean ground beef  
1 small green or red bell pepper or both, diced small (optional if you don't like peppers) or use zucchini squash instead  
1 onion, diced small  
2- 3 cloves of garlic, minced  
1 (10 oz.) can diced tomatoes with green chilies, undrained  
1 (8 oz.) can tomato sauce  
1/2 cup long grain rice, uncooked  
1 teaspoon salt  
1/2 teaspoon dried basil  
1/2 teaspoon dried oregano  
1/4- 1/2 teaspoon ground cayenne pepper  
1/2 teaspoon ground white or black pepper or 1/4 tsp each  
a few dashes of Tabasco  
1 small to medium head of cabbage, chopped or diced about 1/2 pieces  
1 cup Colby cheese, shredded

**Directions:**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Start browning the ground beef together with the oil

Add the bell peppers, onions and garlic, finish browning the meat and veggies; this may take 6 -8 minutes.

Stir in the tomatoes, tomato sauce, rice, salt basil, oregano, cayenne, ground pepper and Tabasco to taste

Spread the entire mixture into an ungreased 9" x 13" casserole baking pan

Top with cabbage and cheese

Cover and Bake for 65-75 minutes or until rice is tender

## **Rock, Mineral, Gem and Fossil News:**

The last remaining open and non-designated areas in the California Desert are being identified and given designations through **S 414: California Desert Conservation and Recreation Act of 2015**. If enacted this bill will remove the Cady Mountains from the Wilderness Study Area and reopen it to multiple use status, it will create two new National Monuments with special attached conditions which will guarantee that current open roads and trails will remain open and accessible to motorized usage and current Recreational activities will continue to exist which includes Recreational Rockhounding/Prospecting.

For the first time in recent history this bill will create an Advisory Committee as a legislative action and will create a seat on the committee for a representative from the Rockhounding/Prospecting Community. This means that we will have a place and a voice alongside the Federal, State, County, City, Department of Defense, Utilities, Conversationalists, OHV, Hunters and other users of the California Deserts. This will be a big opportunity for us to get involved in shaping the Recreational hobbies in the California Deserts for generations to come.

There is still much work to be done if we wish our hobbies to continue on our public lands. Your voice, ideas and knowledge is needed to carry our hobbies forward. So get involved when ever and where ever possible.

It is understandable that with the nature of our hobby, the equipment will get some bumps and bruises, which is acceptable. But if parts are lost or broken, it is the responsibility of the 'borrower' to repair or replace missing or broken parts. Further details of the equipment check out policy is on the form which you will sign when receiving the item.

Earl Sterrett, 858-922-4547, will be able to assist you with the equipment checkout. He asks that you give him a couple of days' notice when you might need something, and when items are returned that they are CLEAN. All equipment must be returned by the meeting following when it was checked out. Equipment is located at Diablo Mini Storage in Escondido.

**G.P.A.A.:**

Treasure Seekers of San Diego is a chapter of G.P.A.A.. This does not require you to become a member of G.P.A.A. but if you are, please advise them that you are also a member of TSSD, so that we are eligible for 'points' from your membership. TSSD uses those 'points' to obtain opportunity raffle items.

**TSSD Library:**

Treasure Seekers of San Diego has a tremendous library for its members' usage. Librarian, Roz Laffoon, will gladly assist you in checking out books, magazines, VHS/DVD's that show you gold locations and history, treasure hunting, maps and knowledge of what to look for. **Claims Assessment Work Form:**

Each and every time you are at one of TSSD's claims, you should be completing a Claims Assessment Work Form (located in the front of the claims guides, or at the meetings from the Claims Guide Seller). This form needs to be turned into Robert Cook, TSSD Claims Manager, at the meetings or e-mailing it to him at: [rmjcc@cox.net](mailto:rmjcc@cox.net) or surface mail to: 1941 Rockhoff Road, Escondido, CA 92026-1113.

Needed information required: Claim used, Members name, Date used, Total people prospecting and time on the claim, Type of work done (clean up, maintain, filling in holes, etc.), Members signature, Claims access, Vehicle access, Claim Markers, Claims Guide Directions, Type of equipment used, Type of gold found.

It sounds like a lot, but it really is not. This information is needed to prove that our claims are being worked. If BLM questions us as to the use of our claims or wants to close one of our areas to prospecting we want to be able to produce records that show that our claims are being used.
