## **Political Action Committee Needs Your Signature**

Please be sure to see Bill Myers to add your signature to a letter opposing the "Feinstein Land Grab". You will be supporting Representative Paul Cook (Apple Valley) who authored HR 3668.

HR 3668, the California Minerals, Off-Road Recreation, and Conservation Act, presents a balanced approach to protecting, managing, and using our desert and forest areas in San Bernardino and Inyo Counties. This bill deals with managing existing federal land and does not increase federal landownership. HR 3668 offers a sensible solution that addresses the needs of our off-highway vehicle recreation areas, protects mineral and mining sites, while still preserving our majestic desert landscapes for future generations.

HR 3668 is the first ever National Off-Highway Vehicle Recreation Areas covering slightly over 300,000 acres of Southern California desert. The new designation would ensure future administrations could not reverse course and close the areas to motorized vehicles. Representative Paul Cook's bill would keep some of the Mojave Trails area open to miners and allow more off-road vehicle use.

### **Pineapple Angel Food Cake**

Take a box of Angel Food Cake mix (just the contents of the box, no need to follow the directions on the box), & combine it with a 20 ounce can of crushed pineapple in its own juice.

(No need to use a mixer, just stir it with a spoon)

When you do this, something magical happens.

The mixture starts to froth & it turns into an amazingly airy, fluffy bowl of deliciousness right before your eyes.

Once it's all mixed up, grease pan (I used Pam spray) and simply pour it into a 9 x 13 cake pan & bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

## **California Penal Codes for Claim Jumpers:**

California Penal Code – “THEFT”; “GRAND THEFT”

Title 13 – “OF CRIMES AGAINST PROPERTY”

Chapter 5 – “LARCENY” (Section 484-502.9)

Section 486:

Theft is divided into two degrees, the first of which is termed grand theft; the second, petty theft.

Section 487:

Grand theft is theft committed in any of the following cases:

- (a) When the money, labor or real or personal property taken is of a value exceeding nine hundred fifty dollars (\$950), except as provided in subdivision (b).
- (b) Notwithstanding subdivision (a), grand theft is committed in any of the following cases:
  - 3(c) When the property is taken from the person of another.

Section 487d – Grand Theft; gold dust, amalgam, or quicksilver:

Every person who feloniously steals, takes, and carries away, or attempts to take, steal, and carry from any mining claim, tunnel, sluice, undercurrent, riffle box, or sulfurate machine, another’s gold dust, amalgam, or quicksilver is guilty of grand theft and is punishable by imprisonment pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170.

Section 1170. (h)(1):

Except as provided in paragraph (3), a felony punishable pursuant to this subdivision where the term is not specified in the underlying offense shall be punishable by a term of imprisonment in the county jail for 16 months, or two or three years. Fine authorized in addition to prescribed imprisonment, see Section 672.

California Penal Code §672:

Upon a conviction for any crime punishable by imprisonment in any jail or prison, in relation to which no fine is herein prescribed, the court may impose a fine on the offender not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000) in cases of misdemeanors or ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) in cases of felonies, in addition to the imprisonment prescribed.

## **G.P.A.A.:**

Treasure Seekers of San Diego is a chapter of G.P.A.A.. This does not require you to become a member of G.P.A.A. but if you are, please advise them that you are also a member of TSSD, so that we are eligible for 'points' from your membership. TSSD uses those 'points' to obtain opportunity raffle items.

## **Did you know...**

1. If you invite a guest to one of the claims held by TSSD you **MUST** be in attendance. Writing a note or permission slip to be on the claim and prospecting **WITHOUT** you is a **NO-NO**. This is for liability reasons. In the last several months TSSD members have come across people working our claims with these so-called permission slips (and verbal permission) from individual members.
2. A mining claim only holds the rights to the minerals and the land is normally owed by BLM. But there are laws and regulations that govern a mining claim and the liabilities that go with it. And we, as Treasure Seekers of San Diego, need to protect our rights and liabilities to our claims.
3. The same goes for the GPAA claims. Please refer to the GPAA mining claim handbook for their rules.
4. Treasure Seekers of San Diego looks forward to many good years of prospecting for the members and we do not want to lose any of our claims due to a violation. Again guests are always welcome – but you need to be in attendance with their presence. And they must sign TSSD's liability form in order to prospect.

### **TSSD Equipment for Member's Use:**

- 2 Sluice Boxes – 3 feet long
- 1 Sluice Box – 4 feet long
- 1 Mini Recirculating 9 inch sluice with pump, motor and tub
- 1 Mini Recirculating sluice with pump and motor (no tub)
- 1 Highbanker with motor and pump
- 1 Small Dry Washer (no leaf blower)
- 1 Large Dry Washer (Keene 151 with leaf blower)
- 1 Magnetic Sweeper on rollers
- 1 Au-nique Vac

TSSD has equipment that it loans to its members. All we ask is that anything that is checked out is returned in the same or better condition than when it was borrowed. It is understandable that with the nature of our hobby, the equipment will get some bumps and bruises, which is acceptable. But if parts are lost or broken, it is the responsibility of the 'borrower' to repair or replace missing or broken parts. Further details of the equipment check out policy is on the form which you will sign when receiving the item.

Earl Sterrett, 858-922-4547, will be able to assist you with the equipment checkout. He asks that you give him a couple of days' notice when you might need something, and when items are returned that they are CLEAN. All equipment must be returned by the meeting following when it was checked out. Equipment is located at Diablo Mini Storage in Escondido.

Librarian, Roz Laffoon, will gladly assist you in checking out books, magazines, VHS/DVD's that show you gold locations and history, treasure hunting, maps and knowledge of what to look for. ## **Claims Assessment Work Form:**

Each and every time you are at one of TSSD's claims, you should be completing a Claims Assessment Work Form (located in the front of the claims guides, or at the meetings from the Claims Guide Seller). This form needs to be turned into Robert Cook, TSSD Claims Manager, at the meetings or e-mailing it to him at: [rmjcc@cox.net](mailto:rmjcc@cox.net) or surface mail to: 1941 Rockhoff Road, Escondido, CA 92026-1113.

Needed information required: Claim used, Members name, Date used, Total people prospecting and time on the claim, Type of work done (clean up, maintain, filling in holes, etc.), Members signature, Claims access, Vehicle access, Claim Markers, Claims Guide Directions, Type of equipment used, Type of gold found.

It sounds like a lot, but it really is not. This information is needed to prove that our claims are being worked. If BLM questions us as to the use of our claims or wants to close one of our areas to prospecting we want to be able to produce records that show that our claims are being used.

Claim Assessment Work forms are available at the sign in table. Please return to Robert Cook.
