Please be sure to sign the petition 'against/opposing' the current language in the BLM 2017 Budget Proposal regarding the increase in "the annual maintenance fees under the General Mining Law of 1872 and eliminates the fee exemption for miners holding ten or fewer mining claims" (page BH-12, paragraph 3 under Hardrock Mining Reform). This does not pertain to just Hard-rock mining. If you read the actual language, it is written to be inclusive and will affect placer claims.

The petition is addressed to Congressman Ken Calvert, Representative of the 42<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District, South Riverside County, who is the Chairman of the Interior Subcommittee Members.

I-8 south to OCOTILLO

Exit “Imperial Hwy” – turn LEFT and go under the freeway.

Most vehicles can travel this road, but a high clearance vehicle is suggested. (Ford Escape made it with no problems.)

**What to bring:**

Food, Water, Hat, Gloves, Walking/hiking boots

Collecting bags and tools, Newspaper to wrap your finds in and a Full tank of fuel

**Agenda:**

We are hoping to spend at least one hour at each location.

One location looking for natural copper infused rocks.

One location looking for petrified sea shells, selenite, agate, jasper &amp; chalcedony.

Another location looking for petrified wood along with agate, jasper &amp; chalcedony, spherical concretions.

All areas are within a short (30 minutes or less) drive of each other.



**MARCH OUTING #2:****HAUSER GEODE FIELD****March 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>, 2016****LOCATION:**

From Escondido – take Hwy. 15 to Hwy. 10 East.

Exit Willey's Well Road

Travel approximately 17 miles on Willey's Well Road to Imperial/Riverside County Line/Ashley Road Flats.

TSSD in the past has camped at this junction, just pull up a spot of desert to camp in. (north-west side of Willey Well Road)

Other camping is available on a first come basis at Willey's Well Campground and Coon Hollow Campground if you wish to pay for camping, which you passed coming in.

Please watch for snakes as they have been known to enter camp.

**LOGISTICS:**

Coming from Escondido –

Fuel, ice, water and whatever is available in Indio or at the Chiriaco Summit.

Coming from Hwy. 95 (Blythe) –

Fuel, ice, water and whatever is available in Blythe.

Wiley's Well Road is a maintained dirt road – good for all vehicles.



To explore the area surrounding Wiley's Well Road, a high clearance vehicle is suggested.

From the TSSD suggested camp spot you can explore Hauser Geode Beds, Potato Patch, Opal Hill, Pebble Terrace and the Bradshaw Trail.

This is a DRY camp location. No water. No fuel. No Electric.

From the suggested camp you are 7 miles from the Geode Beds

### **SUGGESTED TOOLS:**

Hand picks, small shovel, collecting buckets, something to wrap your finds in, gloves and a hat.

### **HOW TO LOCATE GEODES:**

Geodes are found in groups located in volcanic ash beds, which is why they are referred to as geode beds. At first glance geodes look like sphere-shaped, brown, muddy rocks and can easily blend in with the landscape. They are lighter in color than the darker varnished rocks which cover the land surrounding the geode beds, so they can easily be identified once you know what to look for. Geodes vary in size. Some are as small as a cherry and others are as large as a grapefruit.

### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:**

Much information is available on the internet or at the public library regarding the Hauser Geode Beds, Pebble Terrace, and Opal Hill. The choice is yours to research before you head out.

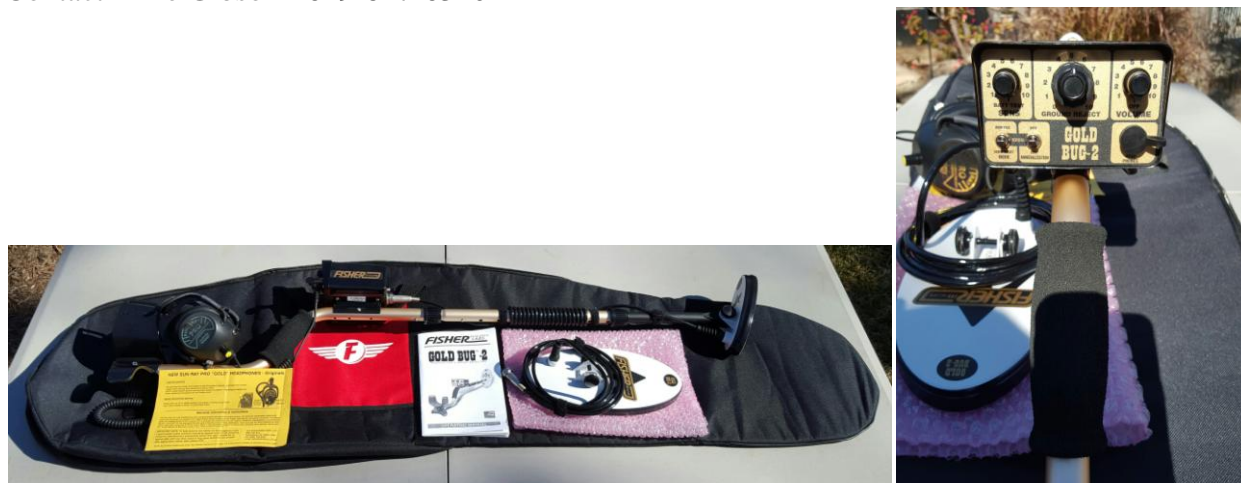

He asks that you give him a couple of days’ notice when you might need something, and when items are returned that they are CLEAN. **All equipment must be returned by the meeting following from when it was checked out.** Equipment is located at Diablo Mini Storage in Escondido.

Each and every time you are at one of TSSD's claims, you should be completing a Claims Assessment Work Form (located in the front of the claims guides, or at the meetings from the Claims Guide Seller). This form needs to be turned into Robert Cook, TSSD Claims Manager, at the meetings or e-mailing it to him at: [rmjcc@cox.net](mailto:rmjcc@cox.net) or surface mail to: 1941 Rockhoff Road, Escondido, CA 92026-1113.

Needed information required: Claim used, Members name, Date used, Total people prospecting and time on the claim, Type of work done (clean up, maintain, filling in holes, etc.), Members signature, Claims access, Vehicle access, Claim Markers, Claims Guide Directions, Type of equipment used, Type of gold found.

It sounds like a lot, but it really is not. This information is needed to prove that our claims are being worked. If BLM questions us as to the use of our claims or wants to close one of our areas to prospecting we want to be able to produce records that show that our claims are being used.

Claim Assessment Work forms are available at the sign in table. Please return to Robert Cook.
