Metal Detecting with John:

For the August metal detecting, 7 TSSDers went to Ocean Beach and we all found something. Here's the summary sorted by \$\$ found:

Jack Stangle 56 coins @ \$7.00; 2 junk earrings

Cliff Vaughn 35 coins @ \$3.32; 3 keys; junk ring and bracelet; toy truck

Larry Bridgeforth 31 coins @ \$3.10; 20 cent Singapore coin

Jerry Kaplan 32 coins @ \$2.55; token; Marine brother necklace pendant

John Howe 27 coins @ \$2.11

Brian Kinnear 1 coin @ \$0.05; Ray Ban shades; 2 dog tags; junk necklace and the winner of the **SKUNK**. (wet sand)

Jon Cunningham 2 coins @ \$0.02. Gets a SKUNK pass for his first time and he's using a brand new machine.

I just wanted to point out an observation. If your machine is ON and its swinging and you understand what it's telling you, you still have to be where the targets are. Jack was the only hunter detecting south of the Lifeguard Station. Everybody else hunted north. You can see that he found more than twice the money as the 2nd place finisher and more than half of all the \$\$ found.

Lesson 1: if you're not finding targets, maybe you should move to another spot.

The same story with the Coinshooter hunt at Lake Skinner the next day. I think there were 3 TSSD'ers hunting and for the 2-hour hunt, Mark, the leader, hunted in a large field and found more than \$6. Way

more than the rest of us who were hunting in other areas. Brian Kinnear and I went out for an after-hunt and he hunted a different area of the same field and he found \$6-7 I think. I hunted around the field (in the shade) and found a couple of bucks more.

For the September hunt, I've got another conflict. Coinshooters are having their monthly hunt on Sunday, Sept 11th, the same day as our regular club hunt. They're having a Scavenger Hunt at Mission Beach and I've never been to one. It sounds like fun. Since we have several members in both clubs, I'm changing the club hunt to Saturday so the hard-core detectorists can attend one or both. Conflicts only happen a couple times a year and I only go to the "interesting" ones.

For TSSD I'm thinking Coronado on **Saturday, Sept 10th**. It's the week after Labor Day so there'll probably be some stuff that the other hunters missed. It's a BIG beach.

Miner's Cookbook Corner:

Pear or Apple Autumn Dessert

Ingredients:

1 large ripe pear or tart apple, peeled and thinly sliced
1/2 cup water, divided in half
2 tablespoons granulated white sugar
1-2 tablespoons golden raisins, optional
1- 2 teaspoon butter
1/8 teaspoon ground cinnamon
Dash of ground nutmeg
1 tablespoon cornstarch
2 slices of cinnamon bread, toasted
Ice cream or whipped cream, optional
drizzle with caramel topping

Directions

1. In a saucepan, combine the pear or apple slices, 1/4 cup water, sugar, raisins if desired, butter, cinnamon and nutmeg. Cook over medium heat for 8-10 minutes or until fruit is tender.
2. Combine cornstarch and remaining water until smooth; add to fruit mixture. Bring to a boil, stirring constantly. Cook and stir for 1-2 minutes or until thickened. Serve warm over cinnamon toast. Top with ice cream or whipped cream and /or caramel if desired.

Yield: 2 servings.

Attendance Year:

Treasure Seekers of San Diego has an unusual attendance year. We were founded in May and our elections are held in April. Thus our yearly attendance requirement runs from May to April. You are required to attend a meeting every three (3) months in order to maintain your membership status.

Membership Cards are to be worn:

Your “blue” colored Membership cards are to be worn at the meetings and while at the claims.

This way we know that you are already a member.

Not to be stored in your claims guide or in a drawer or your vehicle.

TSSD Membership:

Membership to Treasure Seekers of San Diego is free. We do not charge an annual due. All that is asked is that you attend meetings, participate and support the group through its opportunity drawings and events. To maintain membership, you **MUST** attend one meeting every quarter.

1 st meeting:	Complete and turn in a membership application.
2 nd meeting:	You will be given your TSSD membership card.
3 rd meeting:	You will be able to purchase a TSSD Claims Guide with proof of your membership card.

G.P.A.A.:

Treasure Seekers of San Diego is a chapter of G.P.A.A. This does not require you to become a member of G.P.A.A. but if you are, please advise them that you are also a member of TSSD, so that we are eligible for ‘points’ from your membership. TSSD uses those ‘points’ to obtain opportunity raffle items.

Conduct and Code of Ethics:

Members shall conduct themselves in the highest ethical standards and reflect no discredit upon this association. This standard shall be one of the qualifications for membership in this association. Any violation of these standards shall be deemed grounds for expulsion.

Termination/Suspension of Membership:

The Board of Directors, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members of the Board, may suspend or expel a member of the Corporation for cause after an appropriate hearing before the Board. The term “for cause” shall include (a) the member's conviction of a felony, acts of reckless endangerment, failure to perform commitments made to the Corporation, conduct on the part of the member that would render him/her ineligible for indemnification if required by the Board and member conduct which constitutes a conflict of interest with TSSD.

How many is too many?

How many ‘guests ‘on our claims is too many?

Re-read your Claim Rules and Regulations that you signed when signing your membership application (a copy is in the claims guide – 3rd page, 3rd paragraph).

“The TSSD claims are for the use of TSSD members only. A guest can only go to the organization claims with a TSSD member. A limit of 2 guests with an additional 2 guests by permission of the TSSD President. The guest is limited to two visits and then must then become a member of the TSSD and purchase a TSSD Claims Guide. Unruly guests are the responsibility of the corresponding TSSD member.”

So those of you who invite more than 2 guests, time after time after time, are in violation of TSSD Claim Rules and Regulations and will place you in a NOT good standing with the association and your membership can (and will) be withdrawn.

Police yourself.

Don’t ruin it for yourself or others.

See someone Claim Jumping:

If you see someone that you think is claim jumping one of our claims – you need to do the following: Photograph the person, vehicles, equipment and whatever else you can and send the information to the Board including the date, time and location of the possible offense.

He asks that you give him a couple of days’ notice when you might need something, and when items are returned that they are CLEAN. **All equipment must be returned by the meeting following from when it was checked out.** Equipment is located at Valley Rose Self Storage, 1566 E. Valley Parkway in Escondido.

Those people who borrow equipment, and do not bring it back in the same condition or better, or do not bring it back in a timely manner, will be restricted from future access to the equipment.

Claims Assessment Work Form:

Each and every time you are at one of TSSD's claims, you should be completing a Claims Assessment Work Form (located in the front of the claims guides or at the meetings from the Claims Guide Seller). This form needs to be turned into Robert Cook, TSSD Claims Manager, at the meetings or e-mailing it to him at: rmjcc@cox.net or surface mail to: 1941 Rockhoff Road, Escondido, CA 92026-1113.

Needed information required: Claim used, Members name, Date used, Total people prospecting and time on the claim, Type of work done (clean up, maintain, filling in holes, etc.), Members signature, Claims access, Vehicle access, Claim Markers, Claims Guide Directions, Type of equipment used, Type of gold found.

It sounds like a lot, but it really is not. This information is needed to prove that our claims are being worked. If BLM questions us as to the use of our claims or wants to close one of our areas to prospecting, we want to be able to produce records that show that our claims are being used.
