President's Message:

Greetings Treasure Seekers;

It's hard to believe it has already been a month, time really flies as the year comes to an end. Last month I talked about getting back into the desert for the fall prospecting season. This month I need to talk about the ability to stay in the desert, mountains, forests, streams, and use our public lands. We are very fortunate to have this current administration vs the possible alternative, no matter whatever else happens on the rest of the political front. Some of the very first executive orders from President Trump reversed President Obama's public land and waterways grab from a year ago March which "nationalized" first the public lands and then later in the month the public waterways. What these actions originally did, was completely take away OUR lands and waters and made them private government property. so much for public land held in trust by the government for the benefit of the people. As it had been done by executive order there wasn't a lot we the people could do about it. Now, while we have our land and waters back and everything looks great at the moment, we really need to use this reprieve to be vigilant and put in place a system to keep this from happening again. I believe the heavy lifting will be accomplished by groups such as American Mining Rights Association(AMRA), Western Mining Alliance(WMA), Mineral and Mining Action Committee(MMAC), Public Lands for the People(PLP) and others. As your political action person, I will attend and report back to both you and the board on these groups and who it appears will be the best to support for the greater benefit of our Association. Several years ago, we all supported PLP while the dredging suit was going through the courts and they seemed to be the best until their internal struggle. WMA seems to be pulling more for the larger commercial concerns, MMAC is trying to get legislation through Congress to protect our mining rights and get back to the original mining districts and Shannon Poe of AMRA has opened a line of communication with the current administration and Secretary Zinke, as well as, confronted the various BLM field offices threatening suits and educating the supervisors with case law. So far, he has restored Steve Hunt back to the Gold Eye Mine in Quartzite, and challenged the Barstow office over road postings and closures surrounding the Route 66 Gold Miners claims and gone after the BLM in NorCal over dredging.

I attended the recent Oktoberfest gathering organized by Jeff and Reb Baraglia and backed up by Jim and Sue Jeffries as a fund raiser and awareness weekend at the Slash X Cafe and Ranch. Five of the SoCal Associations were represented; Route 66, TVP, Valley Prospectors, Hemet, and ourselves. Ken and I were the only ones from our respective groups and it would have been nice to have had some company. The weather was great, there were a total of 150 people at dinner, we did a little digging and had a chance to meet and talk to a lot of great folks. This is not the time to sit idly by and pass a sigh of relief. You need to get involved and support some of these groups in order to keep your rights.

On other fronts this month's trip will be to the Cargo Muchacho claims, and John Howe made the find of the year so far when he found the **One Ring** or "ring of invisibility" of Middle Earth on Sunday's metal detecting at La Jolla Shores Sept 22. I know La Jolla is special, but a part of Middle Earth? Way to go Mr. Frodo. He did try it on and alas didn't disappear. It is probably on the chain around his neck....my precious....

Easy & Quick Corn Pudding

1 can whole kernel corn, drained
1 can cream corn
1/2 cup butter
1 cup (8 ozs) sour cream
1/4 cup parmesan cheese
1 box of Jiffy corn muffin mix

November TSSD Outing:

TSSD's "Cargo" Claims

Treasure Seekers of San Diego will be holding their monthly outing, Saturday and Sunday, November 18th & 19th, 2017 at the "Cargo" claims (located in the TSSD mining claim guide).

Dry Camping only. No hookups No Bathrooms.

There is plenty of room for tents, vehicles, motor homes and trailers.

This is wide open desert.

You must be self-sufficient. There are NO facilities in the area.

It is approximately 2 ½ hours to a 3 hour drive south from Escondido, approximately 180 miles.

LOGISTICS:

Hwy. 8 towards Yuma, AZ.

Exit Ogilby Road and turn Left (over the freeway) - Travel 3.9 miles

Turn Right onto Sidewinder Road – just past the R/R Tracks

Travel approx. 2.5 miles to BLM Route #715 (aka: Jackson Gulch) - Turn Left.

Cross over the Power Line Road (Route #592), Travel 7/10ths of a mile and start looking for a place to camp. This puts you near the corner of Claim #1.

Motor homes and trailers are able to get to this point.

To explore the actual claims, you must have a high clearance vehicle.

You can get gas, ice and supplies at the following locations off of Hwy. 8:

1. Golden Acorn Casino near Campo – large RV and truck fueling area. Hwy. 8 and Crestwood – Exit #61.
2. 4th Street in El Centro – turn right and then make the first right to a truck stop or you can turn left from the freeway and there are smaller gas stations in that direction.
3. Hwy. 8 rest stop – WATER ONLY – there are two bibs, bring your own hose. Located in the center of the Hwy. so be in your left lane. This approx. 3 ½ miles before Ogilby Road turnoff.
4. Hwy. 8 and Sidewinder Road – small gas station good for fuel and ice. It is not recommended taking this Sidewinder Road to get to the claims, as it is sometimes deep with sand. You should go back to Ogilby Road.
5. 16th Street in Yuma, AZ. – ARCO station on your right. You must travel back to Ogilby Road.

Check the weather for Yuma, Winterhaven and El Centro area before you go – plan accordingly. Weather does vary and winds do come on unexpectedly.

This is a clean desert – please keep it that way by picking up your trash and hauling it out. And, PLEASE, cover your holes.

Our claims can be accessed by Routes #715, 714, 709 and 708.

If you are traveling the current day "American Girl Road" – you are NO WHERE near our claims!

Make sure you are on a TSSD claim. Many, many claims by others butt up to TSSD's.

Must have TSSD Claim Guide and TSSD Membership Card with you while on TSSD's claims.

Directions: (Coming from San Diego)-

I-8 south to OCOTILLO

Exit “Imperial Hwy” – turn LEFT and go under the freeway.

Turn RIGHT on “Co. Hwy. S80”(Evan Hewes Hwy.) - (frontage road that runs parallel to the freeway)

Travel approximately 4.2 miles

Turn LEFT on ‘Painted Gorge Road’

Pull over to the side of the road and wait for the others.

Then you will travel to another location looking for petrified wood along with agate, jasper & chalcedony, spherical concretions and more. Where you can explore and collect till you get tired.

All areas are within a short (30 minutes or less) drive of each other.

What Do You Mean My Membership and Card Has Expired:

If you do not have the new 'beige' colored membership card then your membership with TSSD has expired and you are no longer considered a member of TSSD in good standing.

This means that you are no longer able to use the TSSD claims – period.

If you are on a TSSD claim without a current "beige" membership card then you are considered "claim jumping" and legal recourse could be taken.

Holding a TSSD claims guide does not give you the right to work our claims. You must have a current membership card as well.

See page 10 and 11 for membership requirements.

G.P.A.A.:

Treasure Seekers of San Diego is a chapter of G.P.A.A. This does not require you to become a member of G.P.A.A. but if you are, please advise them that you are also a member of TSSD, so that we are eligible for 'points' from your membership. TSSD uses those 'points' to obtain opportunity raffle items.

GPAA update . . .

GPAA is no longer selling their Membership Kits to clubs/associations. I will be carrying the kits at my shop Columbia Metal Detectors. Attendance Year:

Treasure Seekers of San Diego has an unusual attendance year. We were founded in May and our elections are held in April. Thus, our yearly attendance requirement runs from May to April. You are required to attend a meeting every three (3) months in order to maintain your membership status.

Membership Cards are to be worn:

Your "beige" colored Membership cards are to be worn at the meetings and while at the claims.

This way we know that you are already a member.

Not to be stored in your claims guide or in a drawer or your vehicle.

TSSD Membership:

Membership to Treasure Seekers of San Diego is free. We do not charge an annual due. All that is asked is that you attend meetings, participate and support the group through its opportunity drawings and events. To maintain membership, you **MUST** attend one meeting every three (3) months.

1 st meeting:	Complete and turn in a membership application.
2 nd meeting:	You will be given your TSSD membership card.
3 rd meeting:	You will be able to purchase a TSSD Claims Guide with proof of your membership card.

Conduct and Code of Ethics:

Members shall conduct themselves in the highest ethical standards and reflect no discredit upon this association. This standard shall be one of the qualifications for membership in this association. Any violation of these standards shall be deemed grounds for expulsion.

Termination/Suspension of Membership:

The Board of Directors, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds (2/3) of all members of the Board, may suspend or expel a member of the Corporation for cause after an appropriate hearing before the Board. The term “for cause” shall include (a) the member's conviction of a felony, acts of reckless endangerment, failure to perform commitments made to the Corporation, conduct on the part of the member that would render him/her ineligible for indemnification if required by the Board and member conduct which constitutes a conflict of interest with TSSD.

I Still Receive the TSSD Newsletter – does that make me a member?

Receiving the TSSD Newsletter, “Finders Keepers”, does NOT make you a member of TSSD. You must meet the requirements for active membership.

TSSD has equipment that it loans to its members. All we ask is that anything that is checked out is returned in the same or better condition than when it was borrowed. It is understandable that with the nature of our hobby, the equipment will get some bumps and bruises, which is acceptable. But if parts are lost or broken, it is the responsibility of the "borrower" to repair or replace missing or broken parts before the return date. Further details of the equipment check out policy is on the form which you will sign when receiving the item.

Earl Sterrett, 858-922-4547, will be able to assist you with the equipment checkout. He asks that you give him a couple of days' notice when you might need something, and when items are returned that they are CLEAN. **All equipment must be returned by the meeting following from when it was checked out.** Equipment is located at Valley Rose Self Storage, 1566 E. Valley Parkway in Escondido.

Those people who borrow equipment, and do not bring it back in the same condition or better, or do not bring it back in a timely manner, will be restricted from future access to the equipment.

Claims Assessment Work Form:

Each and every time you are at one of TSSD's claims, you should be completing a Claims Assessment Work Form (located in the front of the claims guides or at the meetings from the Claims Guide Seller). This form needs to be turned into Al Ockert, TSSD Claims Manager, at the meetings. Needed information required: Claim used, Members name, Date used, Total people prospecting and time on the claim, Type of work done (clean up, maintain, filling in holes, etc.), Members signature, Claims access, Vehicle access, Claim Markers, Claims Guide Directions, Type of equipment used, Type of gold found.

It sounds like a lot, but it really is not. This information is needed to prove that our claims are being worked. If BLM questions us as to the use of our claims or wants to close one of our areas to prospecting, we want to be able to produce records that show that our claims are being used.

Claim Assessment Work forms are available at the sign in table. Please return to Al Ockert or to Charlene Myers at the sign in table.

See Someone Claim Jumping:

If you see someone that you think is claim jumping one of our claims – you need to do the following: Photograph the person, vehicles, equipment and whatever else you can and send the information to the Board including the date, time and location of the possible offense.
